

Expression of honour

DIXON House's art therapy group has run an exhibition to honour much-loved Clayton identity Edna Grant, who died earlier this year.

The neighbourhood house's Expression Through Art class has been holding *Hello, Goodbye* at The Highway Gallery to display the group's works and remember 92-year-old Ms Grant, who was one of its founding members.

Established just over eight years ago, the program has been funded by a Home and Community Care grant to offer people with a disability and/or are aged and frail the opportunity to explore their

creativity through art. Past art works include the colourful mosaics that stand out along the walls of Clayton's Dixon House.

Co-ordinator Lynn Elder said Ms Grant was known for her "feisty character" and "genuine concern to help others".

Some of Ms Grant's work is also on display at the Mt Waverley gallery and she features in a DVD running alongside the art, showing the process the class complete their paintings.

Last year money raised paid for a number of improvements and expansions of services including new ECG machines at Dandenong and a blood analyser for Clayton.
